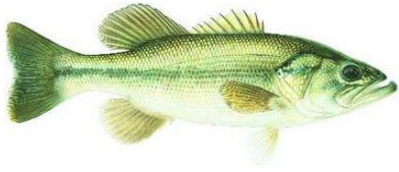


# HARVEY COUNTY WEST PARK LENGTH AND CREEL LIMITS



**Largemouth Bass**

**Largemouth Bass:**

- \*Mouth extends back beyond the eye.
- \*Part of a group known as the Black Bass, which includes the Spotted and Smallmouth Bass.

**Length Limit:**

Under 18-inches must be released.  
**Creel:**  
 5 per day.



**Wiper**

**Wiper:**

- \*Stripes faint, only one extend to tail
- \*Deep bodied, more than one-third length.
- \*Appears very similar to a white bass. Wiper has two rows of teeth near the rear of the tongue. The white bass has a single tooth patch on its tongue.

**Length Limit:**

Under 18-inches must be released.

**Creel:**

2 fish per day



**Saugeye**

**Walleye:**

- \*Walley have a white tip on lower lobe of their tail.
- \*Walleye usually do not have blotches below their lateral line.

**Saugeye:**

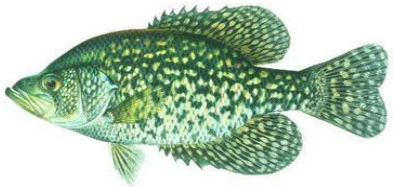
- \*Saugeye have distinct blotching on the sides with scaled cheek.
- \*Spotted dorsal fin.

**Length Limit:**

Under 18" must be released. Either species.

**Creel:**

2 per day. Either species



**Black Crappie**

**Black or White Crappie:**

- \*Black Crappie have a uniform dark flecking without visible barring while White Crappie has visible vertical barring.

**Length Limit:**

No limit.

**Creel:**

50 per day



**Channel Catfish**

**Channel Cat:**

- Deeply forked tail with two distinct lobes.

**Length Limit:**

Under 15-inches must be released.

**Creel:**

5 per day.



**Flathead Catfish**

**Flathead Catfish:**

- Broad, flead head with a jutting lower jaw. Mottled brown to nearly yellow in color.

**Length Limit:**

Under 15-inches must be released.

**Creel:**

5 per day.

**CULLING:** Once a daily creel limit of any particular species have been possessed, any other fish of that species that is caught must be released immediately, unharmed, into the water. It may NOT replace another fish already in the creel.

**THE POSSESSION LIMIT ON ALL FISH IS THREE TIMES THE DAILY CREEL LIMIT.**
